4. Do not wave to your children during the concert.

After all, they do know who you are already, and they know you are there; you most likely brought them to the concert.

5. Do not take flash photography.

You do not want your child to fall off the stage from blindness, do you?

6. Do not walk down the center aisle with your video camera.

Video cameras work just as well from the back of the auditorium. (Besides; the light is usually not good enough for video taping anyway.)

7. Do not leave as soon as your child's portion of the concert is over.

All of the students deserve a full audience for their performances. Remember, next time your child's song(s) could be last.

8. Applaud at appropriate times.

Some musical selections have several sections. Remember, it's not over until all of the sections of that selection have been performed.

9. Do not leave the auditorium during the music.

Wait for a break in the concert to visit the restroom, unless you are carrying a screaming child, in which case you should leave quietly and quickly. PLEASE!


10. Go to the concert expecting the best.








Smoke On The Water.....Blackmore, Gillan, Glover, Lord, & Paice arr. Paul Murtha

The song's lyrics are based on true events, chronicling the 1971 fire at Montreux Casino in Montreux, Switzerland. It is considered the band's signature song and the guitar riff is considered to be one of the most iconic. It is also one of the "banned" guitar songs at music stores, partly because it is usually played incorrectly! In 2004, <u>Rolling Stone</u> magazine placed the song at number 434 on its list of the "500 Greatest Songs of All Time". <u>Total Guitar</u> magazine ranked the song's riff number 4 on its "Greatest Guitar Riffs Ever" list, and in March 2005, <u>Q magazine</u> placed it at number 12 in



its list of the 100 greatest guitar tracks. In 2017, the song was inducted into the Grammy Hall of Fame.


The Avengers.....Alan Silvestri arr. Michael Brown

In November 2011, Marvel announced that Alan Silvestri, who scored <u>Captain America: The First</u> <u>Avenger</u>, would write and compose the score for The Avengers (making him the first composer to score more than one movie in the Marvel Cinematic Universe). Silvestri stated, "This is actually a very unique experience [for me]. I've worked on films where there have been a number of stars and certainly worked on films where there have been characters of equal weight in terms of their level of importance and profile in the film, but this one is somewhat extreme in that regard because each of these characters has their own world and it's a very different situation. It's very challenging to look for a way to give everyone the weight and consideration they need, but at the same time the film is really about the coming together of these characters, which implies that there is this entity called the Avengers, which really has to be representative of all of them together." Silvestri recorded the score with the London Symphony Orchestra at Abbey Road Studios in London, England.
